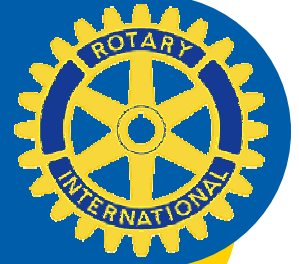

What is the mission of our Rotary Foundation?

The mission of The Rotary Foundation is to enable Rotarians (you and me) to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

What does our Rotary Foundation do?

PolioPlus

Rotarians have mobilized by the hundreds of thousands to ensure that children are immunized against polio, a devastating, crippling and often fatal disease. Since the inception of Rotary's PolioPlus program in 1985, more than two billion children have received oral polio vaccine. To date, 210 countries, territories and areas around the world have been declared polio-free. We are now on the brink of eradicating this tenacious disease - with your help it will become a reality.

Disaster Recovery allows Rotarians to donate money in response to specific disasters. Funds are distributed to committees in need to support their recovery efforts. The Foundation is currently administering four Disaster Recovery accounts: Hurricanes Stan and Wilma (Guatemala and Mexico), Hurricane Wilma (United States), the Earthquake in India and Pakistan, and Solidarity in South Asia.

Humanitarian Grants

The Rotary Foundation matches contributions raised for international service projects by Rotary clubs and districts in two or more countries. The Foundation

Rotary Celebrates 100 Years

Canada Post has approved a new commemorative stamp to recognize 100 years of Rotary service in Canada. A special ceremony will be held at the RI Convention in Montréal to present the new stamp. RI President John Kenny, Past Trustee Chair Bob Scott and Canada Post representatives will unveil the stamp this Saturday, June 19th.

If you will not be in Montréal the stamp will be on sale at all postal outlets and post offices across Canada after the ceremony. There is also an outstanding first day cover which you can order by calling 1.800.565.4362.

A second recognition will take place this Friday, June 18th, when the CN Tower will be lit up in Rotary blue and gold to honour Rotary International's 100 years in Canada.

Rotary & the World Cup

Since February, Rotary has had a soccer ball traveling through a number of polio-affected countries in Africa, raising awareness of our eradication effort. In many nations, its arrival has coincided with immunization activities, and Rotarians have celebrated by holding public rallies and inviting government officials

Last week, Bill Gates signed the ball in Abuja, Gates commended Nigeria for making significant gains in the fight against polio and called upon the country's leaders to finish the job. Gates was in Nigeria to learn more about the dramatic decline in polio cases

provides a one-to-one match for District Designated Fund contributions and a 50% match of club funds for health, hunger, water / sanitation, microfinance and literacy projects in developing world countries.

This year Toronto East partnered with 9 other D7070 clubs to provide water, sanitation and nutrition gardens for 16 villages in Africa. Our efforts will impact thousands of families.

District Humanitarian Grants

The Rotary Foundation provides a one-to-one match of club funds for local humanitarian projects.

This year Toronto East received a \$2000 grant to assist with the purchase of seniors transport for Woodgreen Community Services.

Educational Programs

Peace Scholars:

Each year, up to 110 scholars are sponsored to study at one of the seven Rotary Centers for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution for a master's-level degree. You can nominate a candidate.

Group Study Exchange

Annual awards are made to Rotary districts to cover travel expenses for a team of non-Rotarians from a variety of professions. Rotarian hosts organize a four week itinerary of vocational, educational, and cultural points of interest. Since 1965, more than 57,000 individuals (almost 12,000 teams) from 100 countries have participated. *This year TERC hosted the team from India and we can nominate candidates every year.*

Ambassadorial Scholars

The Foundation sponsors one of the world's largest scholarship programs. Since its inception, we have awarded over 47,000 scholarship to individuals from 110 countries. *The outgoing scholar from D7070 was sponsored by TERC.*

since February 2009. This year, only three cases have been reported in the country through 8 June, compared with 298 during the same period in 2009.

The soccer ball is entering the final leg of its four-month journey. A grand campaign finale was held in Alexandria, Egypt, on June 12th. Africa Cup of Nations champions kicked the ball, symbolically kicking polio out of the continent. Egyptian First Lady Suzanne Mubarak presided over the event, which was also attended by children who have survived polio, and many dignitaries. From there, the ball is now traveling to the RI Convention in Montréal. In addition, thousands have added their signatures to a virtual ball online.– www.kickpoliooutofafrica.org

Since Rotary and its partners began their fight against polio in 1988, the incidence of the disease has been reduced by 99 percent. In Africa, only Nigeria remains polio-endemic, but the disease still affects children in many other high-risk countries, emphasizing the importance of protecting all African children against polio. This year we will immunize 85 million children on the African continent.
